**RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD
TO PROPOSE EXCEEDING LEVY LIMITS**

RESOLUTION NO: 2013-01

Whereas, the State of Wisconsin has adopted levy limits on town, village, city and county levies for 2013 and thereafter under s. 66.0602 of Wis. Statutes;

Whereas, s. 66.0602 of Wis. Statutes limits the local levy for 2013 to a percentage increase of no more than the greater of (a) 0% of the allowable 2012 town tax levy based on the state's levy limit law or (b) a percentage equal to the percent change in equalized value due to net new construction; which for the Town of New Haven is 4.408 percent;

Whereas, the Town Board of the Town of New Haven, Dunn County believes that for the 2013 tax levy (collected in 2014) it is in the town's best interest to exceed the state levy limit as described above by a greater percentage than 4.408%.

Whereas, the Town of New Haven's adjusted actual levy for 2013 is \$138,959; and further whereas the state law would limit the increase to \$6,135 for a total allowable town tax levy of \$145,084 for 2013, collected in 2014.

Now, Therefore the Town Board of the Town of New Haven, Dunn County, does hereby resolve and order as follows:

1. The town board supports an increase in the town tax levy for 2013 (to be collected in 2014) that will exceed the state levy limit.

2. The town board directs that the question of increasing the allowable town tax levy for 2013 (to be collected in 2014) by 28% percent, which would increase the town levy by \$40,623, on an ongoing basis, for a total town tax levy of \$185,707, shall be placed on the agenda for the special town meeting to be held on November 19, 2013.
